# 1ST GRADE REPORT

Although the forwards were deficient in rucking and tight play generally they gave a spitited response to Tony Maxwell's more than - able leadership.

John Hirsch and Geoff Tubbenhauer were the other two forwards to get the motes as best players. In the packs John Dyer gave another good exhibition at full back, with Harry Clark and Edward Suttell also getting votes.

Peter Yates is also worthy of a mention for his fine running and determination to attack whenever possible.
