1ST GRADE REPORT

FROM THE TOUCHLINE

The firsts had a morale boosting victory over Elizabeth last week, with a convincing total of 20 points to 10.

We put enough pressure on Elizabeth to control play and by the latter stages of the game we were winning a few lineouts! Scrumming improved, but we didn't fare well enough in the high number of malls and loose rucks that ensued. Not easy to see how we could lose possession, after we had the ball to begin with. Neil Schwarzer kicked low through a gap in the opposition and Chris Watters (wing in this game) gathered the ball to run and score beside the corner post. A good interception by Kym Watters started a long rush in which Eric Thiele went over and Mick Logan converted. This try was a magnificent effort and culminated a good match by the team.

I can't narrow my list of best players this week as there was good play by many. Tulley Leickie is high on the list and his game was a beauty, Kym Watters had another great game and Dave Farrow returned to the side with a vengeance and was by far the best forward. Fern Szuster was often prominent and well up with the action. Neil Schwarzer showed constructive form and also on my list are Chris Watters for certain, Rod Hauser who kept his opposite number in check, Grant Grace, Mick Guerin and so on.

But I feel we should have gained the two premiership points had we exerted ourselves a little more in the first half.

3RD GRADE REPORT

The third had a satisfactory victory over Elizabeth by 8 points to 6. Although the winning margin was slight the win was of merit, because of a number of factors. The team had lost seven of its regular players 5 to the seconds and 2 injured. The opposition were the strongest apart from North Adelaide, whom we have met this season. Despite the lack of combination caused by the loss of the regular members, the team set out to play an attacking game, and **succeeded** to the extent that they scored two tries to two penalty goals.

The **task** now facing the thirds is to rebuild the team spirit and combination, which existed before the wholesale changes mentioned previously were forced on the Club Selectors. This can be achieved by regular training and by careful adherence to the Coaches tactics. In particular the forwards must re develop the technique of tight play which the previous pack had achieved.

Our tries were scored by Sel Lipscomb, after a good back line movement, and by Tony Maxwell who backed up centre Peter Yates, after the latter had cut through the Elizabeth backs.

Although the forwards were deficient in rucking and tight play generally they gave a spirited response to Tony Maxwell's more than - able **leadership**.

John Hirsch and Geoff Tubbenhauer were the other two forwards to get the votes as best players. In the packs John Dyer gave another good exhibition at full back, with Harry Clark and Edward Suttell also getting votes.
