### 1st Grade Match Report

#### Old Colls 36 v Onkaparinga 42

Coming into the game Old Colls and Onkas had already played twice this season, taking a win each. Onkaparinga looked like they would run away with it after rushing to a 30 to Nil lead, but Old Colls showed character to fight back and come away with 2 table points from the match, ultimately running out of time to complete what would have initially seemed an unlikely turnaround.

Onkaparinga took control of the game in the early stages, driving up the middle of the field through their forwards and then swinging wide to score up the wing in the first couple of minutes. Old Colls were uncharacteristically slow to react, and though we were competitive at the set piece, there were few chances for us to convert this into meaningful possession or territory in the first half. We rarely held the ball for any length of time in attack, and our poor first-up tackling created easy chances for Onkaparinga to break our line, consistently putting us on the back foot to be swarmed by their excellent support play.

Within the first half hour Onkas had blitzed Old Colls to run in 5 tries, 4 of which were started from or behind halfway, and they had also kicked a penalty. After the fifth try, Old Colls won a scrum in the centre of the field and finally kept ball in hand, with Smedley directing phases to the right wing where Mann broke the line and, after going through several hands, Sadler crossed and converted to improve the half time score to 30 to 7. Both teams had chances early in the second half, but eventually Old Colls took the upper hand and began to build momentum. A lineout near the Onkaparinga 22 was taken in and driven up by the forwards before going through the hands of the backs to the opposite wing, where McDonough almost made it to the line, offloading to Taylor who scored. Shortly after the restart, Mann made a good run off the back of a scrum and popped to Sadler who chipped over, and was taken out late by, the last defender. Old Colls were awarded a penalty that was taken quickly and Mann drove over and scored near the posts.

Old Colls were looking calmer and held the ball off the kick off, with the backs and forwards combining well for multiple phases and making good gains until we had a lineout 5m from the Onkaparinga line. The throw was held and the forwards piled on the pressure, as Dawes led from the front and scored to bring the deficit back to 4 points. Onkaparinga went on the attack and missed tackles cost us again as they scored another try, but Old Colls responded to soon be back in their red zone, where Dawes again showed strength in close to go over for another short range try.

Onkaparinga came back with one more try, then on the restart Old Colls forced a turnover on the 10m line. After the scrum the forwards made big gains in a series of quick recycles, focussing the attack through the middle of the rucks, making it to the 22 before swinging the ball wide for McDonough to score in the corner. Unfortunately this proved to be last play of the game, but the players could hold their heads up for pulling things back together after such a disappointing start.

The second half started well with Jarrod scoring within 5 mins. We rumbled the ball extracting a couple of penalties which placed us in Onkas 22 where Blake found his way to the line. We brought on reserves and things slowed down while the team adjusted. Possession was alternating and the ball moved up and down the pitch.
