
At the end of each Monday training, we hold **internal matches** within each squad

AUSTRALIAN 2015 MASTERS OVER 35'S JUNIOR CRIPPLED CROWS UPDATE

Saturday 3rd October dawned - a warm one for the 2015 Masters Games held at Dry Creek.

The Junior Crippled Crows over 35s team rolled up with a great showing of 26 players itching to have a go. The first team sheet saw the following players take the field, including a healthy complement of Old Collegians amongst the players and support staff: Lenny Eilers, Fraser Vivian, Mike Riese, Justin Elder, Richie Czgelik, Peet Arnold, Sandy Taylor, Matt Conner, James Denley, Stew Douglas, Nate Sos, Jon Collins, Dave Nolan, Craig Wilson, Glen Adcock, Matt Horrobin, Rob Costanzo, Perry Finbow, Craig Barlow, Dave Phillips, Julian Bennett, Matt Scharpel and Colin Boulden. And so it was the Moorabbin Rams that we met in our first match of the day. As an unknown quantity we started the game with some strong running from both backs and forwards. The game turned in to an arm wrestle with attack and defence being aggressive both ways. In the end it was the Junior Crows that came out on top with a close 15 to 12 win over the Rams. This win set the tone for the Junior Crippled Crows and the rest of the day.

Against the Port Old Pirates we found a fellow South Australian team. The first half looked like it could be another arm wrestle but the second half turned into a bit of a route with no less than seven try scores for the game. Peet's boot saw him covert four out of eight tries into a very blustery North Westerly wind, not bad as all penalties and conversions had to be taken as drop kicks. New inclusions to the team sheet for this game were *Ben Suttell*, Serge Naumenko and myself (*Jamie Punshon*). The final score for this game was 52 to 24 with a second win to the Junior Crippled Crows.

Game three kicked off at 2:25pm and what a match this turned out to be against the Vic Barbarians Blue side. Big hits were felt by both sides but it was the Vic Barbarians that were feeling the pinch at half time not having dominated as they thought they would at the start of this match. The Junior Crows gave as good as they got and no quarter was given throughout the match. The Barbarians ran in two converted tries but were unable to hold off a well-disciplined and skilled display of rugby from the Junior Crippled Crows that finally resulted in a 19 to 14 win to the Junior Crows. So the first day came to a close with the Junior Crippled Crows being winners of Pool B.

Sunday dawned as hot as Saturday and the games the previous day had taken their toll. Of the original 26 players that started Saturday we were down to 21. The first game was against the Buggered Old Buggers from Geelong. The Buggered Old Buggers grabbed the first points and set the tone for the match. From there the Junior Crows were playing catch up. The first half saw a bit soreness being run out and handling errors occurring with lack of cleaning out at the rucks being a factor. This was cleaned up in the second half but unfortunately the Buggered Old Buggers proved there worth and booked a spot in the gold medal match later that day.

With the close of our fourth match for the weekend it was becoming apparent that the player's bodies were not going to be able to take much more of a pounding. So I took it upon myself, as Manager, to have a chat with the Vic Barbarians Manager, Ian. It turned out that the Barbarians were in the same position. A compromise was suggested, by us the Managers which was subsequently approved by the match officials, that a 15 man Boat Race would take place instead of a match to decide the Bronze Medal winner. And so at 1:30pm the two teams gathered in the centre of pitch 1 and had a Boat Race. It was a close run, with both sides showing their prowess but, in the end, it was the Junior Crippled Crows who took out the race by one player to be awarded Bronze medallists in Rugby for the 2015 Masters Games.

In closing I'd like to thank all of the team but especially *Kate Denley* for her talent in First Aid and strapping, *Graham Raymond* for his skills in Management and Coaching and lastly the three players who never got the chance to take the field due to injuries and illness leading into the games, Brad Wills, Fred Els and Brendan Sinnott.

The Crippled Crows above 45's also finished with a bronze medal, beating Burnside in the play-off. Old Collegians was represented on field in the above 45's by *David Pyper*, *Paul McCarthy & Brett Watters* and a number of volunteers - thank you to all! A good and memorable weekend of Rugby was had by all.
