# **Premier Grade Match Report**

The first grade started the game quite flat, struggling to retain possession and were not aggressive enough in defence, allowing Woodville to build momentum and run in 2 tries before Old Collegians fired up and got into the game. Proceedings weren't helped when Taylor and Smedley were both forced off following a head clash in the first half, but good cover defence from McDonough and Rokobaro helped to limit the damage on the scoreboard.

Old Collegians' set piece was reliable and after 25 minutes a scrum win in our half was distributed quickly by Phillips to Macklin, where a short pass cut Bartlett into the line and he weaved through the Woodville defence and scored on a long run. Woodville put the restart out on the full, so Old Colls pushed up with ball in hand from the resulting scrum and earned a penalty after Woodville infringed in a ruck. Old Colls kicked for touch and went into the 22 for a line-out, securing the ball then going wide where Pickerill crossed in the corner. Woodville pressured hard on attack in the last moments of the half and scored again to take a 15 to 12 lead into the break.

We were more direct in attack in the second half and were much more convincing at supporting and clearing our own rucks to keep possession. Woodville were penalised again on a ruck in their 22 and Old Colls kicked for a line-out 5m out where after we set a driving maul Woodville didn't engage, but Old Colls adapted to hold the drive and instead Hyam split the maul and burst through the Woodville line for a try. Woodville replied soon after and retook the lead with a try after going wide from a lineout in our 22, but Old Colls tightened up and kept them out for the rest of the game.

Old Colls attacked from another penalty in the Woodville 22 and Pickerill was stopped just before the line, but Rokobaro was supporting closely and went from the back of the ruck to score. Mann ran hard from the restart to break the defensive line then offloaded to Hyam and in turn Taylor who was dragged down by the final defenders, with Campion arriving in the next wave and he could not be stopped.

We lost the ball soon after KO, won a tighthead, only to be penalised at the first breakdown. We end up giving another penalty about 30 out from our line and fortunately their attempt is wide to the left. Rams press us in our half until we get a penalty and the relief of a lineout throw 15 on the right side of centreline. That lineout is lost and Rams break through with ball carrier and support streaking to a certain try. Then we saw Chingi run down the ball carrier who made a good pass to his support. Chingi spun and launched to deck the ball carrier and kill the try. He contested the ball until the cavalry arrived and secured it. Sensational stuff. From here we worked the ball into our half only for Rams to gain possession and run it back well into our patch. This went on for several cycles before we broke the cycle by holding the ball through enough phases to place us in a position to take a few stabs at the line. Rams defence is solid and defends several serious raids before forcing a knock-on.
