

The first grade continued their strong start to the season with a well fought win over Brighton. Brighton were the first on the board with a penalty but Old Colls hit back quickly when Pickerill



At times basic handling was an issue for Old Colls and several unforced dropped balls gave Brighton chances that they were quick to push into our territory. They scored next with a try from inside our 22 and pushed hard to do so again, but our defence held strong and earned a turnover. Cleary ran the ball out for some good yardage before Sadler took possession and beat the remaining defenders with a skilled chip and recover for a try at the other end of the field.

Old Colls held possession and through several set piece moves worked back into Brighton territory where Sadler grabbed a third try of the half. Brighton kept in touch with a try before half time to take the score to 26 to 20. Unfortunately, Old Colls put themselves under pressure from the kick-off in the second half, and several errors gifted possession to Brighton and we were lucky not to concede more points. Eventually Brighton did score another try to take a 1 point lead, which they maintained as we kicked a penalty and they replied in kind.

As the game wore on both sides struggled take control, but the impact of our reserves helped to swing proceedings back into our favour. Old Colls improved with ball in hand and Rudi, Riady and Hyam combined to make a great break out of our half, eventually passing to Leen and he scored in the corner. Campion secured the restart and the backs put in a long kick that was regathered by Macklin, who ultimately scored under the posts after a slick pass / pass back with Sadler.

Old Colls were starting to look dangerous and in the final minutes Smedley at halfback snuck through a lineout in our half and got as far as the Brighton 22, where Howlett and Verrall set and combined well in a lineout, giving a good platform for the backs from which Burgess ran a crisp straight line to break through in the centres and notch the final try.

## **U18's Match Report**

#### Old Collegians 25 v Brighton 31

We arrived at Brighton expecting a tough game based on results in the first two rounds. Unfortunately, Joel Pepper, George Campbell, Rory Illman & Ben Gough were not available this week. So selection was a challenge and moved a few boys away from their preferred positions. A late withdrawal meant we were unable to put up a front row – so we requested to go uncontested. This meant we had to start with 14. Putting Harshad Bilimoria onto the bench, Jimmy Francis out to fullback. With only two on the bench.

The start was solid. Five phases of possession from receiving the kick. Both forward packs attacked and defended strongly. OCs opened the scoring with a try out wide left to Awin Mathews (I think it was him? or Ben 10?) Not converted 0 - 5. Fifteen minutes in Brighton got a penalty on the 22 and converted it; score now 3 - 5.

Brighton were playing a possession game, sharing the ball between their forwards and inside backs. First up tackles tended to be high and ineffective in stopping Brighton's forward momentum. Brighton's strong counter rucking disrupted OCs flow of the ball. Their extra man made it difficult to find gaps to get over the advantage line. Last week the 1 %ers came off – not this week. We continued to fall off some tackles. After trading forward hit ups without either side gaining a lot of field position, Rhys Frew came off having taken several big hits and injured his shoulder.

OCs defence came under pressure and our penalty count rose in the contact zone. A Brighton try converted from out wide right took the score to 10 - 5. Soon after another Brighton try in the left corner from a 10m line-out – converted 17 - 5. OC regrouped, Charlie Pickford took a strong run up the side, supporting backs interplay, then back inside for Awin Mathews to be in under the posts. Unfortunately, we didn't manage to convert this kick.

Half time score: Brighton 17 v Old Collegians 10

Second half opened with Brighton maintaining control of the ball and the game. Two more tries to Brighton. The first - missed tackle let their 8 in. The second - just ran out of tacklers after missing a couple first up. Score now 31 - 10 with around 10 minutes left to play. From the restart, one of Brighton's players tackled Ollie Horne in the air and was given a yellow – we were now even at 14 players each. Something seemed to

click with OC as the clock was ticking...OC scored the last 3 tries using our skill and pace out wide.

Kyle Fleetwood-Pieper running hard, as usual, 15m in from touch. Harry Warner followed up a long kick chase and scored in the corner, finally Awin Mathews streamed away, rag dolled over the line, but we scored (again in the corner). Ben Viljoen wasn't able to convert these in the variable winds.

In summary; our attack remains potent, but our defence across the whole team needs to step up off the line and hit hips not chests.

After 2 successive wins our lads turned up at Brighton facing a team who are talented and always competitive. Disappointment was rife when we discovered there was a 40 minute delay to the game. The Brighton players used this time to stand around looking big and menacing; the majority of ours went for a wander. When it was time to get match ready ours were still wandering, frantic phone calls between coaching staff and the missing ensued and our lads arrived, looking hot and sweaty. The explanations of "we were playing touch" bemused both the coach's and yours truly.

Once again our match had been allocated a young, athletic referee in Chester, it's so refreshing playing the game with the players dictating the speed and flow, not the referee. Speaking of dictating the play boy did we take it to Brighton!!! Their bigger pack was not as mobile as ours (not many are), our scrummaging is immense giving us clean ball on our feed and being disruptive on Brighton's. James Du Preez (Half-back) and George Hewitt (Flyhalf) have developed a great understanding, which usually leads to great decision making and smart rugby.

Early on Brad Killick goes over, it looks like a try, our lads celebrate like it's a try but the referee has seen hands in the ruck and they've been awarded a penalty. Not to be thwarted for long though, great counter-rucking by our forwards gives us turnover ball and Brad Killick gives us the lead. This gives our coach's the chance to get the message to our lads that the pods were too flat, allowing Brighton the chance to stop us behind the gain line. This did improve as the game went on.

Another battling try, this time by Kees Young, followed soon after giving us a 12 point lead and we were cruising. We had the majority of possession and territory which lead to their frustration boiling over and some handbags been thrown around in front of their bench. Suddenly sucker punch - just before half-time they get a break, Jack Richards performed an incredible try-saving tackle but they recycled the ball for an undeserved try under the posts.

Credit to Brighton,  $2^{nd}$  half they came at us through the forwards. They rucked, mauled and played direct. More credit to us, we tackled, counter rucked and gave as good as we got and after 10 minutes they ran out of steam. Then the pattern of the  $1^{st}$  half was repeated with us dominating possession and territory although they got a few breaks allowing Jack Richards to show off his tackling technique, I can also remember a certain try saver from James Rees, Adam Thompson and Kees Young also get notable tackling mentions.

Two more tries later (James Du Preez and Luke Seifert) and Brighton's resistance was broken giving us the chance to analyse our kick-off.

Seems pedantic to find criticism in a great team performance but too often our catcher is isolated and has to fight to retain possession whilst his mates arrive. The amount of tries we score should allow us plenty of practice to perfect this technique. I reckon you boys will be practising this in training soon.

Finally, this week's highlight for me: our own solid scrum lead to quick, clean ball and a fantastic backline move was finished from 20 metres or so with Magnus Illman running it in. George Hewitt was on the bench so we needed a kicker. Not too often does a loose head prop kick the ball, many don't even touch it during the game, but up steps ours and belts it through the posts.
