Premier Grade Match Report

Old Collegians 23 def Burnside 19

The first grade backed up the minor premiership with a win over Burnside and advanced directly to the grand final. Old Collegians showed the importance of getting points on the board early to pressure the opposition, forcing a fumble from Burnside on the kick-off and winning the scrum, where 2 passes out saw Macklin cutting back in through the centres and past the defenders to score under the posts.

Burnside kicked long on the restart and spent a sustained period attempting to break through the Old Colls line, but the forwards held them out up front and McDonough and Sadler roamed the back field defusing Burnside's attempts to kick over the top. The forwards turned over a ruck in our defensive 22 and Mann ran it out up the blind side to over halfway, then the backs went through the hands to the other side of the field where Bartlett ran up the wing and offloaded to Sadler, who beat the last defenders with well-weighted chip and regather before crossing the try line.

Old Colls had a long series of patient phase play to deny Burnside the ball, with our forwards progressing slowly but surely up the field into the Burnside half and 22 then finally rumbling it over as Hyam controlled the final movement to score. Burnside finished out the half again unsuccessfully attempting to break through Old Colls' line and, when a big hit from Macklin forced a turnover, Old Colls took a penalty shot to increase the lead 20 to nil. As the break loomed another turnover from Macklin put Old Colls in a good position on halfway to score on the counter-attack, but as our backs went wide Burnside intercepted the last pass and ran against the play to score and keep them in contention.

The strength and organisation of Old Collegians defence was tested and held in the first 10 minutes of the second half as Burnside attacked with all the possession. The task grew harder in the next 10 when a discussion broke out amongst the respective forwards packs following a scrum and once the cheese was distributed Old Colls were left defending with 13 against 14. It took until the end of this period for Burnside to wear Old Colls down and score, but they followed up with another unconverted try to reduce the gap to 1 point.

With the clock running out our reserves helped to change the momentum of the game. Graham continued his form of regathering restarts and Rokobaro put a long clearing kick into the Burnside 22, with Kyle's chase enabling him to lock up the fullback and our supporting players turned over the ruck. The forwards went wide quickly where Murison took the last defender to create space for Mann to cross the line, only for the try to be disallowed for a forward pass. After the scrum Macklin made another turnover and Burnside were penalised at the next ruck, allowing Sadler to slot a final penalty kick and confirm the result.

If you glanced Reserve Grade qualifying finals score in the Paper or ResultsVault Sunday morning and saw Old Collegians 19 Onkaparinga 0 you might have said to yourself that can't have too interesting but you would be mistaken, because this was more of a contest than that score suggests. This was a game of Forwards, set piece play and field kicking. With just four minutes played, loose head Paul Cleary crashed over for a Try which Mitch Sallis had no problem converting. From then on we had the better of the possession and penalty count. At least until about half way through the first half when the penalty situation reversed was we started to infringe in and around the breakdown. Our defence, the hallmark of our season, thawed Oknas who were not able to capitalise on their opportunities and field position. For most of the half the ball rarely moved out past the centres. The front row of Paul Cleary, Nic Howlett and Dan Higgins all heavily involved for extended periods of play. These guys don't alway get a mention in match reports but they have been terrific all season. Second Rowers Alex Bauve and Alex Murphy also doing a mountain of work, Alexis having one of his best games. Loose forwards Tim Chew, the ubiquitous Sandy Taylor and number eight Luke Clifton rounded out the effort.

Not everything was great and for all the hard work, both sides lacked real composure and coherence as we heading in to halftime (Finals nerves I guess). This was pointed out with some directness by Coach Raymond at halftime. The second half remained a Forwards game. Onkas, when they did get chances, which was fairly often, could not get their field kicking to work where as Stu Robertson was exemplary. Similar story when it came to the line outs which we dominated. We were playing better in this half and with Oknas visibly tiring as they realised they were not going to break us down the result was never in doubt. Rudi Timoteo sub in with about 20 minutes to play to add to the misery of Onkas scrum, and was rewarded with a Try with about ten minutes to play. Mitch added the two points. When Peter Cross scored at the 32nd minute of the half it was game over.

Our second half was better than our first and no doubt some lessons were learnt (or remembered) about Finals footy as we head towards the Grand Final in two weeks time.

Old Collegians 22 def Burnside 10

OC were underdogs going into Sunday's match against Burnside with only 14 players, and having gone down to Burnside each time the teams had met in the minor rounds. The first half was a case of defence sometimes being the best offence, and every player put in to hold off Burnside's attack for the first thirty minutes, despite the overlap. OC's defence was almost impenetrable, shutting down Burnside's runners and closing off options. When the line did break there was a chase down and tackle. It was clear early on that the hard yards tackling at training were really paying off. With five minutes' left of the first half, Burnside finally broke through the defence to score in the corner, and OC went into the break trailing 5:0.

Burnside went over again early in the second half to put the score at 10:0 but rather than get their heads down or panic, OC lifted - answering with a try in the corner from the baby of the team, Abby. With some points now on the board OC stepped it up again, with two forwards tries to Kristie and El (and a conversion from Tara) to level the score and then pull out in front. Both forward tries came after some great forward phases and attacking runs from the backs, which spread the Burnside defence and gave the forwards space to break the line and capitalise.



With a dangerously close margin of 17:10 and time left on the board OC maintained its cool, holding Burnside off with some stellar defence and making the most of any errors. With minutes to go OC was rewarded again, with the dynamic combination of Keely and Tayler creating some great space to give Abby room to score her second of the game in the corner. Soon after we were playing 16 men when they fluffed the substitution. Sadly for us the referee fluffed the penalty decision. Injuries were also affecting structure with Harrison needing replacing due to a hand injury.

Our 2nd try came from Seaton again when, after fantastic Old Coll's goal-line defence Seaton spied an interception chance, claimed the ball then legged it pretty much the length of the pitch. George made the conversion look easy. Alfie was playing out of his skin in defence and support and gave it a go in attack, making a great line break, the long pop just failing to come off.

Second half it all went pear shaped. We seemed to spend more time defending desperately, George showing he can ruck better than most fly-halves when necessary, clearing out to save the day. Tom demonstrated great rucking as well but was harshly penalised



from the ref. The inevitable 2nd try came from a predictable source with them going through forward phases till they found a breach in our defence line despite valiant efforts from our blokes.

We then shot ourselves in the foot. A penalty to us at the halfway line but we were wanting the ref to play the advantage as an accurate kick had them scrambling. He didn't and our complaining led to the penalty being reversed. This lead to Barossa pressure and it was no surprise that they took advantage from this fortune. The conversion was the final score of the game.
