What has historically been a Saturday home game turned into a home weekend with the very well supported Friday night game/s and a full compliment of Saturday games.

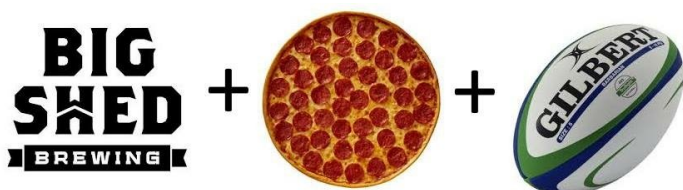

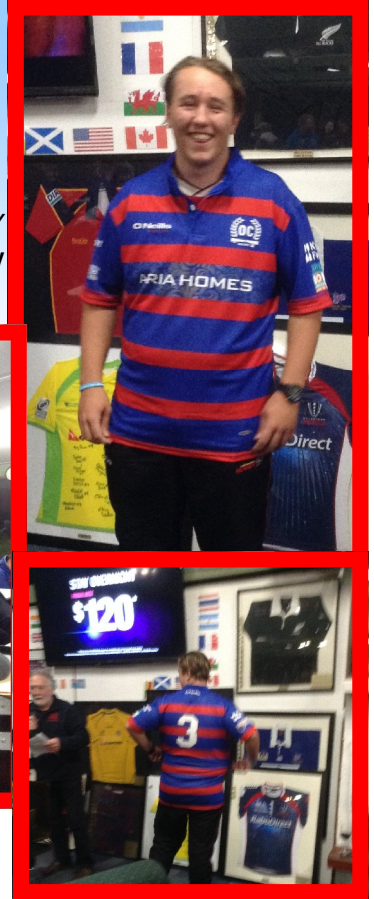

Premier Grade Match Report

Old Collegians 50 def Burnside 32

Both teams had possession early but Old Collegians made it count first from a line out in the Burnside 22, driven up into the corner by the forwards, then Smedley spotted an undefended blindside and dived from the base of the ruck over the line to score. The restart was taken and driven up by our forwards for several phases into the Burnside half before Sadler split the defence with a 30m cut-out pass wide to Macklin, who flicked it on to McDonough on the wing and he adjusted well to dart back in and wrong-step the 3 covering defenders before crossing the line.

Burnside capitalised on a couple of mistakes by Old Colls on the kick-off where the ball was allowed to bounce loose, leading to a line out from which went to the front and made easy metres up the sideline to score. Burnside kicked a penalty goal soon after and were gaining confidence and momentum, but the Old Colls aggression in defence was forcing mistakes and limiting their attacking options. Eventually Burnside coughed up the ball on the mid field and Sadler reeled it in then raced away to score against the run of play. Burnside were undeterred and put strong pressure on the restart, earning a penalty which they kicked into our 22, where their forwards avoided the defensive line out sack as they drove over the line. Play resumed and there were some scrappy passages each way until Macklin broke the line in open play, linking up with Murison and Sadler, before McDonough was able to score his second just before the break and Old Colls took a 26 to 13 lead.

Old Colls were slow to start the second half and Burnside clawed back another try within a few minutes of play resuming. Despite this, Old Colls were able to settle down and worked their way back into the Burnside 22 where their clearing kick off a scrum was charged down by Hyam and scooped up by Sadler who took scored his second try. Consistent phase play once more gave Old Colls a chance in the Burnside red-zone, which was seized with a strong scrum win and distribution to Bartlett coming into the line from full back to bust over and score.

Both teams traded tries in the last 20 minutes, with Burnside spending several minutes in the Old Colls' 22 before grinding their way over. Old Colls were able to get back on the front foot and into attacking range, stealing a Burnside line out and Champion cleaned up then offloaded to Verrall in the clear who finished. Old Colls continued to build good phases with ball in hand until Burnside picked-off and intercepted a pass to score, paring our lead back to 43 – 32, but Old Colls had the final say with Bartlett scoring his second try to round out a confidence building win.

What to make of this round 6 match?

Beautiful day - tick.

Ground in good nic - tick.

Great crowd in - tick.

25 - 24 that's a win, so tick.

And yet there was a feeling that we were so dominant for such long periods of the match that the score should have been a lot to us and not many to them. With a delayed start and slightly shortened playing time due to the management of nasty injuries to Will McLeay and Jarrod Cole in the third grade match, we got off to a great start when Mitch Sallis slotted a Penalty at the 14th minute immediately followed by a terrific try to Peter Cross (Converted by Mitch Sallis).

But in the nature of the match, we conceded a penalty in the 20th minute which Burnside kicked and we go from comfortable 10 - 0 to 10 - 3. Another dominant ten minutes lead to No 8 Luke Clifton scoring what we might now call a trademark try - that kid is a force of nature. Mitch hit the upright but 15 - 3 felt good heading to halftime. Ops, Burnside intercept, score a try and convert right on halftime - it's 15 -10 - you get the picture!

Three minutes played in the second half and a penalty conceded. Burnside choose to kick but the kick misses - phew. Again, dominance of procession gave Mitch Sallis a try scoring opportunity which was well taken but Mitch could not convert. Burnside hit back quickly with another intercept try (converted) and the scores are close again at 20 - 17. Shortly after Burnside's No 9 could contain is pleasure and ended up in the bin. Kyle Fleetwood-Pieper, subbed on at halftime, then score a real fabulous try from a blistering run down the left wing against some close attention.

For the second time in the match Mitch managed to hit the upright. Could the game slip away from us now? It would only take a moment of inattention or silly indiscretion. We confronted a Burnside team with many years experience and considerable weight in the forwards. The first five minutes were spent mainly in the forwards, with the teams feeling each other out. We learnt that Burnside are capable of contesting up front, so move the ball to the left for Scott to score.

Burnside play it tight and keep it largely close to their pack, despite this we gain ground. In possession, we move the ball right via Chester for Mark to score. Another productive run down the right wing comes to an end with a forward pass. A most impressive scrum wrecks the Burnside pack and draws a penalty from which a promising move catches us offside and offers Burnside relief. We are playing with solid structure and after hitting it up for eight phases we are in their 22. Ball is passed out to left wing for Chingy to finish with the points. Next to score is Derek after Otty breaks out and finds Chingy to his left and Derek to his right in support and only a single defender. Close to the break and it is Scotty over for his second after Dan breaks out. 33-0 at the break.

The restart sees us win the ball and a few phases later Otty chips ahead into space, Dan collects and scores in the left corner. Some scrappy play follows, with us in possession for many phases but going nowhere until the ball gets to Tom on the right wing. He chips ahead (to cries of 'Oh Tom NO!') only to confound us by dropping on what was a perfectly weighted kick. Soon after Will goes down with a neck injury. There is a 5 min delay as he is attended to and carried from the pitch awaiting an ambulance. We never regain our composure after the restart and the last quarter is a somewhat scrappy stalemate. A few minutes before full-time Jarrod hits the turf and severely dislocates his right shoulder requiring a second ambulance trip.

Thanks to our first aid and physio support and to Ian Bricher for their management of both of our injured players. I am happy to report that both players are at home recovering albeit both are still very sore. We wish both Will and Jarrod a full recovery.

Our U18s looked great in their new playing strip on Saturday as they took the field, thank you again to all our sponsors, ARIA HOMES, Knight Frank, Pyper Leaker & Direct Home Timber & Hardware. Sadly the game didn't start in the manner which we would have preferred and was delayed following our warm up as a result of injuries incurred during the 3rd Grade match.

We fielded a reworked backline this week, with some of our experienced players not available and also had a number of injuries on the day which lead to a number of player changes. We struggled to get our hands on the ball for large passages of play and spent most of our time defending – which meant very little opportunity for attacking play. Our expansive and dangerous backline attacking play has been one of our strengths in recent weeks but we unfortunately didn't get to see much of that on Saturday.

Burnside owned the first half and dominated the possession. They controlled the forward play with rolling mauls and pick-n-drives. With the half time result: OC (nil) – Burnside (12).

We came out much more focussed and aggressive following the half time break and started to maintain possession and put Burnside on the back foot. We scored 2 tries by George Campbell and Kyle Fleetwood Pieper, which was a reflection of the improved effort and better ball retention. We managed to get our ball in the scrums but so did Burnside – with slow ball for either side. The one aspect of our game that let us down was the line outs, not throwing in straight. This is an area of our game we'll have to work hard on over the coming weeks. Other areas we'll need to focus on include loose play and general ball protection. We made far more handling errors "under pressure" this week as Burnside was fiercely competing for every ball.

Our backline had very few opportunities as they didn't get much forward ball to work with.

On Saturday, whilst watching the U18's versus the same opposition we were informed that the injured Burnside player was cleared of any significant injury so naturally everyone in the rugby community are all relieved about that.
