Old Colls dominated the score board but took a little while to settle in and adjust to what was quite an unstructured game against Souths. Initially we were guilty of trying to do too much and score on each phase, rather than sticking to the game-plan, so it took longer than it should have to solidify the control of the game. However, once the running patterns were established and followed these created multiple scoring opportunities that for the most part were seized by Old Colls.

A scrum 10m out yielded the first points when Mann picked from 8 and went blind to soak up defenders, before passing to Smedley then to Pickerill on the wing to go over in the corner. In open play Sadler at full back caught a high return kick 40m out and threaded it back through the defence for an impressive individual try.

After some scrappy play by both sides, Sadler regathered a loose ball on half way and flicked it to Leen who ran a tight angle in to score from 30m out. Old Colls worked into the Souths 22 and Howlett cleaned up a messy lineout to secure possession, with Smedley sniping from the base of the following ruck to run down the 5m line and score untouched.

Near the end of the half Lee Verrall took a difficult kick-off that was quickly shifted through the backs to the opposite touch line and Leen made a strong break and ground up the wing before flicking an impressive inside pass to Burgess who finished off the try.

The forwards continued to work on the structure in the second half, controlling the set piece and creating space and opportunities for the backs to challenge the Souths line. The general decision making in contact situations also improved with players relying on their support to clean out rather than risking blind offloads.

Further tries followed to Murison, Leen, Bartlett and 2 to Macklin, with 1 in response from Souths.

This week it was one of our faux home games - i.e. the home game we play at Burnside. The squad turned up ready to play on maybe the last hot Saturday of the season.. We had a reasonable looking team and even had three reserves.

As expected, from the outset Elizabeth showed they were a very different proposition than last week's opponent. With ball in hand they protected possession fiercely and were resolute in defence. But we were not intimidated and soon we had what looked to be a slight advantage. We were advancing the ball more effectively when in possession and tackling effectively.

However, we were giving away hard earned metres by far too many careless penalties. We came within a metre from a 5 metre lineout, before Eliz cleared. Soon after they were applying lots of pressure close to our line and went over for the first of two 'held-up' decisions. I'm informed by a player that at least one and maybe both were tries. Sometimes the luck flows our way. Finally a couple of penalties go our way and we get into their 22 from where Will breaks through and scores. Hoppo converts. 7 - nil at the break.

Second half was scrappy from both teams for much of the time. Probably a combination of the heat and early season match unfitness? Play was moving back and forth with a penalty or handling error most often changing the direction of flow.

Eventually Elizabeth hold us deep inside our 22 for sufficient phases to open a hole through which they darted. Not converted. We lifted and managed to hold possession in their territory and draw penalty. It's no time for heroics and Hoppo adds three to our score.

Elizabeth responded with some strong raids on our line which we managed to repel. Late in the match we were again in possession well in their half and drew a convertible penalty. Robbo obliged taking the score to 13-5 just before full time.

Sighs of relief from the side as Elizabeth had given us a tougher workout than the score suggests. And, if the referee saw the held-up tries as at least one of our players did, the result would have been quite different.

Another warm sunny day with a steady breeze and dry, green pitch. Another comfortable win to Colls - this time against Souths. Souths had a bye in the first round, so we had no idea what to expect. From the kick off it was clear both sides had come ready to play. Souths showed good continuity to keep the ball for multiple phases. We showed equal resolve to stop any improvement to their field position with the ball in hand. Rucking and counter rucking early was evenly matched, so the difference was shown in respective back lines. Quick, sure-handed passes moved the point of attack until the gaps opened for fast runners to make a break. This was repeated, with variations, for most of the game.

Overall, the Forwards generally controlled the opposition forwards. Line-outs and scrums were improved, and continue to be a work in progress as per last week. Again some sparkling individual and team ball handling from the backs, especially the pick up off the bootlaces out wide - yes ended in a try.

Souths countered rucks and mauls quite physically and to a degree slowed down Colls ball speed. The number of turnovers (in both directions) was high. Our support to the ball carrier was tardy at times and will be punished by more skilled pilferers. Generally good defensive tackling - from both forwards and backs. The missed/broken tackle count was significantly higher this week. Souths did not get the memo Onkas received and continued to run hard and straight until the final whistle. Only our fast and effective cover tackles prevented Souths scoring more. (PS. Getting up off the defensive line makes the tackles easier.) It was pleasing to note that there was no obvious change to the team structures or skill levels as the reserves were rotated through.

Individual bits: Brad Killick came on in the second half and added some starch to OCs counter rucking. Austin Teagle got a few pilfers.

First run for the year and newbie...we welcome: Charles Pickford, Harshad Bilimoria, Joshua Smith and Sebastian De Boer.

Nice touch towards the end - Newbie Sebastian De Boer came on for his first ever rugby match:

A strong complement of 28 Old Collegians U10s arrived at Tregenza Oval on Saturday morning to face Southern Suburbs (Souths) in Round 2 of competition. Such a fine turnout of players on a game day, even during the school holidays has been very exciting for the coaching group to see, although we've had several players absent from some of the school holiday training sessions.

The same game format was adopted as per the previous weekend, to allow us to field 2 teams, OC Red & Blue, with each Old Colls team playing a third of the game against our opposition club, Souths and a third of the game as a scratch match against each other.
