Old Collegians Luncheon Guest Speaker



Peter Fenton was born in Boggabri, New South Wales and educated at Parramatta High School. He then went on to play over 200 minor grade games for Parramatta and become one of Australia's legendary rugby union coaches.

Peter Fenton's professional career is varied, incorporating his love of writing, film and sport. He wrote and co-produced *The Running Game*, a one hour video on The Wallabies Tour of Great Britain in 1981, *The African Campaign*, a 90 minute video on the Wallaby tour of South Africa in 1992 and *Pick Me Up and Run*, a 50 minute video on how to play rugby, featuring the 1995 Wallabies.

Peter published his first book in 1992, a series of anecdotes on his coaching career and over 50 poems on Australian sport titled *Sport The Way I Speak It*. His second book, a biography on the great boxer, Les Darcy, *The Legend of The Fighting Man* was published in 1994, followed by his third book, *For the Sake of the Game*, released in March 1996, an account of the NSW Waratahs' tour of the United Kingdom and France in 1928/'29. Recent titles include *They Called Him Boy*, Andrew 'Boy' Charlton, the story of one of Australia's great Olympic idols and *Olive*, an account of the heroic life of a north Queensland girl who became an army nurse

when Japan threatened to invade Australia in the early months of 1942.

Renowned as Australia's most prolific sound mixer of feature films, Peter has been responsible for the sound tracks of more than 200 Australian films since the early '70s. His Chief Mixer credits include *Caddy, Sunday Too Far Away, Newsfront, Picnic At Hanging Rock, The Getting of Wisdom, Gallipoli, Phar Lap, The Year of Living Dangerously, Evil Angels, The Russia House, Lightning Jack, I.Q.* and *Six Degrees of Separation.* In 2012 he was the recipient of an OAM for services to the Australian film industry.

It is fair to say that Peter 'Fab' Fenton is highly regarded as a sound mixer, film maker, coach, commentator, author, poet, raconteur, lover of Australian sporting legends... and occasional drinker!

Great to see Ryan 'BooBoo' Nielsen, Derek Lewis and Robbie Paprzycki start in the two's for this top of the table match against Onkaparinga. At the away edition of this fixture in Round 1 Onka's out lasted us for a narrow win, so we knew this would be as much a test of our endeavour and endurance as our skill.

A strong first half performance with tries to Tim Dawes (conv Mitch Sallis), Karl Edgar, Kyle Fleetwood-Pieper and Alex Murphy found us at 22 to nil at halftime. Okna's did mount a couple of challenges but our defence held strong. If the second half went the same way it would be a much easier than expected victory - but it didn't quite. The first 20 minutes of the second half was a seesawing affair. Onka's upped the tempo and it took a good deal of effort to deny them a score. Discipline was good, on both side actually, so there were no clear cut penalty opportunities either. When Mitch Sallis crossed for a try and converted 20 minutes in it looked like game over. But then Onka's hit back with two quick tries, breaking through our tiring defence with disturbing ease. If Onka's could maintain that level of energy our 27 -12 lead could so easily slip away! With 5 minutes to play Derek Lewis scored a well deserved try which Stu Robertson converted. That took the wind out of Onka's sails. And when new recruit Henry Cameron crossed the try line two minutes later it truly was game over.

This match was a testament to our playing depth, defensive effort and ability to create scoring opportunities but there's no doubt that, at their best, Onka's were a hand full. Food for thought there!

An injury requiring ambulance delayed the start of our match and when the whistle finally signalled the start we were facing two 20 min halves.

The injured Onkas U16 player is thankfully OK.

Onkas started strong and held possession while pressing us in our half. After some scrambling defence they broke out wide and scored. We seemed to have become susceptible to loosing possession at the breakdown. It's not long before we again turned it over after a hard effort working the ball into Onkas territory - a kick and we were again defending.. Fortunately, our scrum really worked and a tighthead gave us possession which we maintained until about 30 out where we were awarded a penalty. Nick had a rare miss. We botched the throw to lineout, but win another tighthead from the resultant scrum and kept the ball alive to move well into Onkas territory where we turned it over. Chester gathered a poor Onkas defensive kick, runs it up and fired a perfect long pass to Matt on the right wing.

Matt easily ran around his mark and trots around to place it between the posts. Nick's conversion brought the score to 7-5 at the half time break.

A much better start sees lifted intensity and OC moving into Onkas half to apply loads of pressure. Scott ends up with the ball and ran through the last two defenders for another 5 points, converted to 7 by Nick's reliable boot. Onkas lift from the restart and were soon threatening our line. We gave them a penalty, quick tap, ball wide finds a three man overlap and five easy points. A period of scrappy play sees Onkas give us more frights than we're giving them. Some dreadful kicking gives Onkas free territory and possession. We hold the pill through phases as we ground the ball deep into Onkas territory. Brad scooped up the ball and hoofed it, Jonny Wilkinson style, and we were on. This time following the chase the backs passed it through the hands for Magnus to touchdown.

Our 5th came courtesy of Michael following superb forward pressure. Phase after phase, pod after pod, with great support play, Tom was instrumental among others. The Onkas defence was loaded on the blindside and James Du Preez had the awareness to switch with a superb long pass giving Michael opportunity to score.

More scores looked inevitable however in the 13^{th} minute of the 2^{nd} half an Onkas lad needed medical treatment for a suspected spinal injury and an ambulance was called. The referee had little choice but to abandon the game at this point and award us the win 29 - 0. On the Sunday we received notice that the lad was cleared of spinal injuries so that is naturally a relief.

Once again the win was built on teamwork with 5 different try scorers being testament to that. All of our blokes contributed to this success. Lads, we now have 2 bye weeks so we need to refresh, train hard, keep our fitness levels up come out raring to face Brighton at home on the 23rd July.
