Old Collegians 22 vs Onkaparinga 44

Old Colls lost to Onkaparinga in a frustrating match where we maintained periods of control and effective play in the first and last 10 minutes of each half, but in between too often let Onkaparinga off the hook with poor decision making and lapses in basic catch and passing skills.

In the first 5 minutes Hopkinson continued his recent form with the boot and opened the scoring from a penalty kick. Onkaparinga responded by keeping the ball in close to the rucks to progress up the field into our 22, ultimately scoring from a scrum close to our line. Old Colls looked to have returned the points shortly after when Fleetwood-Pieper beat the defenders on the wing and ran it in from 40m out, only to have the try disallowed for an earlier forward pass.

The frustration grew as Onkaparinga scored 2 more tries through counter-attacking opportunities arising from kicks not being put into touch and dropped passes, whilst we struggled to string more than 4 phases together without an error. On the positive side, when we kept the ball in hand we were hard to stop and the first half ended with a strong drive into Onkaparinga territory on the back of a break by Hopkinson, where Verrall scored from the ensuing ruck to take the score to 22 to 10.

Olds Colls spent most of first 20 minutes of the second half in Onkaparinga territory and it looked like a matter of time before the pressure turned into points, but Onkaparinga turned it around twice for 2 more tries against the run of play, with the intercept of a flat pass and then the turnover of a dropped ball.

With 10 to go Old Colls pegged back some of the deficit when Verrall scored his second, this time from number 8 off the back of a scrum in the Onka 22. Onkaparinga hit back for Valuya Photography

their seventh try before Old Colls were able to

consolidate some possession and work into an attacking position, opening space out wide for Whitehead to breach the defence for the final 5 points.

After the loss last week away to league leaders Barossa Rams it was yet another away game for the welltravelled Old Collegians U 18's, this time with the trip down South to Onka's. As seems typical for our blokes this year we started slowly allowing the opposition to open the scoring with a try under the posts directly from the breakdown. This time the lead was quickly equalised with our opener by Jasper Carter, finishing after a huge run down the left, just rewards for a fantastic season to date. Our forwards then combined superbly, 1st Kees made a run and clever pop to Alfie who made further ground and superb pop to the supporting Brad. After Brad's run the ball was span down the line, a ruck was formed near their try line, quick ball allowed Tom to notch (later his dad stated this was his 1st in 3 years). I can't confirm this stat but for me it was the best team move I have seen this year.

Our backs then wanted some action, Fly-half Ben took possession from our much improved ruck and ball protection to outrace everyone from the half-way line. After a knock Paddy ignored Rob's instructions in taking it easy and protecting himself for Burnside when he used invention whilst scoring our 5th try. After a loose lineout he kicked on twice, soccer style, the ball went over their try line and sat up beautifully for him to make a diving grasp and score. Our 6th and last try was scored by Rory following a big chase from Ben's clearing / tactical kick deep in Onka's half.
