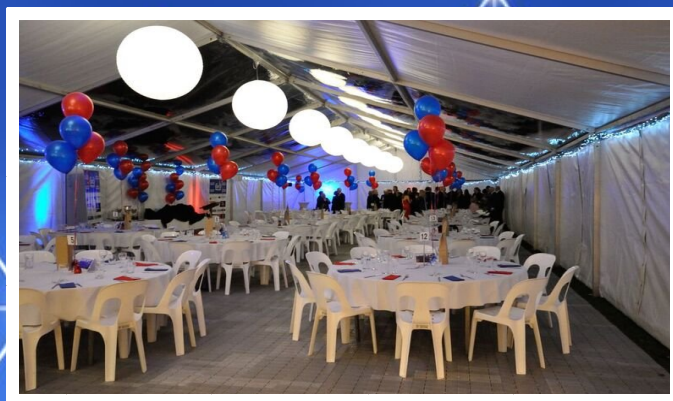

# Coopers Premier Grade Match Report

## Old Collegians 65 v Port Adelaide 29

The First Grade completed the regular season with a strong win against Port and will face Onkaparinga in the elimination final on Sunday. Old Colls maintained good discipline in the first 30 minutes to hold the majority of possession, constantly pushing Port back with efficient phase play to build a healthy lead, as the first 4 tries of the match came from opportunities created in Port's 22.

After a scrum in front of the posts, the backs went wide through the hands to Kyle who scored in the corner; Smedley kicked long to clear the ball from a turnover on half way, with Champion stealing the resulting line out and the forwards then rucked up and drove Hannam over for his first try. From a lineout outside the 22 the forwards kept a rolling maul going to 10m out before Howlett peeled off then pirouetted over the tryline.

The forwards disrupted a Port scrum 15m from their line then won the next ruck, with Litchfield's step creating a hole for Liam to hit on an angle cutting open to score under the posts. Port put their first try on the board after taking possession from the restart, gaining 2 quick penalties and breaching the defensive line 40m out as Old Colls realigned.

Old Colls had another line out on the Port 22 that was brought down then shifted to wide to Bartlett, who brushed his way over in the corner. The attack was on again as the half closed out until Port turned over and ran 95m, only to be brought down by Kyle just short of the line, but in the ensuing plays got another penalty and scored after taking a quick tap to make the score at the break 31-14.

In the second half Old Colls initially managed to regain some of the momentum, but soon had to adjust to play a man down following a yellow card, and couldn't close Port out entirely. Old Colls racked up 2 tries both from chances in close to the try line, with Mann first scoring after taking the ball off the back of the scrum, before Old Colls' next opportunity ended in a penalty try due to one-too many infringements by Port in the red-zone. Port kept in touch by forcing penalties at the ruck and taking the ball back quickly through their forwards, enabling them to trade the next 3 tries with Old Colls.

From the restart Kyle retrieved the kick and the backs utilised quick passing to the centre channel, where Bartlett once more broke through to get his second try from 40m out. After another Port try, Kyle found space to advance down his wing with Hopkinson and Riady continuing the run before being brought down in the 22, where Hannam spearheaded the supporting pack and scored his second.

Port scored their fifth try going wide off a scrum in Old Colls' half, but Old Colls finished out the game with tries in open play to Cleary and to Kyle.

Notably Jack Wilson scored 6 tries and Patrick Sos scoring 4 (one try, where he scooped up the ball from the kick-off, in his own dead-ball zone, and ran and weaved the length of the field to score a try, untouched.)




