Old Collegians 13 vs Brighton 36

The game started in promising fashion with Old Colls holding the early possession and scoring the first points with a penalty. Following this initial success the first grade fell into the trap of playing too predictably and were not able to exploit the opportunities that developed on the field, particularly where Brighton were not committing many to rucks and were able to spread their defensive line wide to smother the attack. Brighton as ever were strong in support in the open plays and drove into our 22, where they took advantage of a loose ball popping out of a scrum close to our line to nab their first try. Subsequently they were able to build their score with 3 penalties and another try in the first half, before Old Colls got one try back as Mann went over after running from 8 off the back of a steady scrum.

The second half held more of the same, where Old Colls had several opportunities and good passages of play to build phases, but suffered for a lack of direction and at times were their own worst enemies when various chances ended with basic dropped passes or intercepts thrown. Conversely, Brighton were able to capitalise on their counter-attack and ran in 2 more soft tries when our tackling began to fall off and let them break the advantage line. In the last 10 minutes Old Colls looked better and varied their attack from side to side to open enough space for Bartlett to break through and run 30m up the wing for the final try, but more consistency is needed throughout the whole game to enable us to keep the pressure on the opposition sides.

The Reserves faced a formidable Brighton side sporting several faces regularly seen in the first grade not so long ago, and a long bench of fresh reserves. We were on the back foot from early on conceding a penal to go 3 behind after ten minutes. Although we worked hard and showed some positive signs, Brighton continued to make inroads and extended their lead to 15 after 20 minutes with two tries, one converted, one not. Some relief right on half time when we were able to kick a penalty (Adam Bearden) and save a first half clean sheet with the score at 3 - 15.

Brighton scored off the restart with a Try (not converted) - not what we wanted really. Then finally some reward for effort when Jack Darby capitalised on a period of good possession to score a Try. Adam Bearden converted.

For all Brighton's dominance to this point, including a period when were down to 14 men after Joel Pepper was yellowed card on the back of a series of team indiscretions, scores at 10 - 20 didn't look so bad. Brighton then, as they did all afternoon, regrouped, made the most of their forward power and quick recycling to wear us down and scored a few minutes later. Undaunted, during the following ten minutes, we played our best Rugby. We won one scrum against the head, got the ball moving quicker, created some sustained pressure that had Brighton going backwards. All collimating with a Try to Adam Whitehead which Adam Bearden converted. Hope springs eternal and it seemed for a few fleeting moments that we might have turned the tide. It was not to be as the fatigue of a physical game took it's toll. Brighton scored two more converted Tries to close out the match and win 17 - 39.

It would be understandable if our boys were a bit rugby weary following a 10 day enjoyable and relatively successful New Zealand tour (1 comfortable win, 2 close losses) to good local opposition. The tourists have had a hectic tour, been white water rafting, watched 2 Super Rugby games, attended Queenstown ANZAC day Dawn Service to list a few. So perhaps the ideal opposition to visit Tregenza for our league opener was

a depleted 13 man Brighton side.

From the start it seemed to be a case of how many tries and points we would get. Our pack had the mobility and ball retention to dominate, even creating a few turnovers from breakdowns. We used the 2 extra men to spin the ball at leisure through the hands. The fact that 10 of our 11 tries were scored by backs are testament to that (the 1 forward to notch was Brad, in scoring the teams 4th after taking an amazing 1 handed catch, ignoring the pleas of the overlapping backs to put his head down and get over the white line himself. The referee added to Brighton's woes in sending a player to the sin-bin for illegal lifting and dropping Ben in the lead up to the score. Following another couple of Old Coll's tries caused by attractive running / spinning rugby Brighton notched themselves. Recycling it through their forwards following pressure in our own 22. Second half Brighton strengthened their numbers by adding a couple of U16's, however this addition could not stem the tide.

On Saturday 6th May the Old Collegians U10's took on Brighton Black at Parkinson Oval and Brighton Gold at Tregenza Oval. The OC Blue team was lead by Coach John Kinniburgh and the Red team by Coach Colin Macfadyen, with Coach Matt Bell interstate on business.

The OC U10 Blue team lost the match by 7 tries to 5 in a closely contested game, which we allowed to slip away towards the end. Brighton Black was playing with good structure and their team passed the ball through the hands, which allowed their fast backs to get into space. They scored a couple of runaway but good team tries, which reminded our team that we need to be on top of our first time tackles if we want to be competitive for the full duration of the game. Brighton succeeded with 5 conversions from their 7 tries and we succeeded with 3 conversions from our 5 tries. Brighton retained their backline structure a lot better than us. A special mention goes to Mathew Spark for scoring his first try (the smile on his face was priceless), Ivan Arnold for crossing the white line twice, Charlie Waltham with a try as well as Louis Clementson scoring too. Louis played with tremendous determination! Sasha Humble also lead very well from the front and kept the order and structure for us in the scrum.

We tend to cling onto the ball too much and better judgment how and when to offload will be a key point of emphasis at training over the coming weeks. Tackling (wrapping our arms around the player, hitting with the shoulder, whilst putting our head in a safe spot) will be another focus area. Clean out at the breakdown for the full duration of the game is another aspect of the game we will be focussing on. We should recognise how well Brighton moved the ball though the hands to the players that are in space, this created many opportunities for them from which they scored.

A special thank you to Coach Juan Aguiar who refereed the Blue team's game for us at Parkinson and Mark Pickard who refereed the Red team's game for us at Tregenza.

The Red team had a hard day at the office, with Salvy crossing the white line once. Brighton Gold was on top of their game scoring 6 tries and 1 conversion. The game feedback was similar to the Blue team, with the same areas identified to work on at training. Salvy Costanzo, Jenson Grudnoff and Thomas King

were rewarded with certificates for exceptional play.

A special mention goes to Kate Mocatta who made numerous tackles and played very well for a second week in a row.


Development Officer


