### **Coopers Premier Grade Match Report**

The first grade continued the trend of starting the game well and defensively had a much improved performance from the last couple of weeks. The set piece functioned smoothly as the forwards battled against a strong pack upfront, providing a solid platform for the backs who scored all 5 tries, whilst better communication in defence and marshalling from Cross helped to keep Souths scoreless.

Old Colls took possession into Souths territory early for a try to Burgess running straight up in the centres, and he featured again soon after with a line break into the 22 where he offloaded to Hopkinson who finished to build the lead to 12. A couple of handling errors put Old Colls on the back foot and allowed Souths to spend much of the rest of the half on attack, but lower tackling in general helped to check their momentum and they unsuccessfully resorted to long-range penalty kicks to try and get some return.

In the second half the strength of the squad of players comprising the 1s and 2s showed through as Teagle, Cleary, Litchfield and Whitehead each made important contributions from the bench to keep the pressure on. Old Colls were most dangerous when implementing the simple aspects of attack well to provide quick ball recycling, enabling them to switch the focus from across the field quickly whilst going forward, creating space for Litchfield to score next down the wing.

Old Colls resettled the attack and from a line out near half way sent the ball wide through the hands for Litchfield, Fleetwood-Pieper and Bartlett to get around the defenders and Bartlett dotted down the bonus point try. The forwards rumbled some effective possession up the field towards the end of the game where Mann made good break into the red zone, offloading to Hopkinson, again in support, who straightened and ran the last 20 to score the final 7 points.

If the history of the last few years is anything to go by, matches against Souths follow a predicable trajectory. Start well. Souths close the gap. Scores close at first time. Then things can get interesting. If your guard is down Souths are masters at exploiting their opportunities. Wouldn't be the first time we looked up at the end of the match to see we have lost. On the other hand, perhaps depending on how many first graders get pulled or fitness or hard work, the pendulum can swing quickly in your favour. So what would it be in this Round 4 match?

Two minutes played and Souths Winger's pace blew away our defence to power over for a Try, duly converted. Wow - where did that come from! Time to regroup, settle down and use the ball. The rewards came from hard work with three Tries in twenty minutes - Karl Edgar (1) then Adam Whitehead (2). Adam took the kicking duties for the first time and converted one of the three. A nice 17 to 7 lead with five minutes to half time. But Ah, you know what's coming. Out of nowhere Souths, a man in the bin, conjure two Tries. Lucky they could not convert either. And here we are - half time and scores level at 17 a piece.

With three losses from three so far, this was a game that we really needed to win. In some ways the first half was a period where the team got to know each other. It was the first game for Harry Warner (Hooker), George Campbell (Prop), Austin Teagle (Flanker) and Ned Morcom (Wing). Jed Campbell, back in after a break for concussion, played Outside Centre instead of his normal Flanker role. A first for him. It was the also first time Nic Litchfield played at Fly Half and Adam Whitehead at Fullback. Derek Lewis came into No 8 for his first start in the 2's for this year. Are you getting the picture!

It could have fallen apart but then it clicked, and boy did it click. Within a minute of the restart Derek was over the line. Six minutes later Karl took this second Try. Now, Adam found his kicking rhythm to convert. The Forwards were in control and delivering quality ball thanks to Lee Verrell, Justin Elder and especially Austin Teagle. Next it was Ned Morcom's turn to score. Then a truly wonderful play which came from wide on the left from inside our own half that had all supporters on their feet. Started by Ned Morcom it was a perfect example of something that was practiced at Thursday night training - committing the defender and passing. At full speed from Ned to Full Back Adam Whitehead to Nic Litchfield. So simple, so well executed, so exciting to watch. Sports commentators and coach's say the sign of a good team is when you play poorly and still get the win. We must be awesome as we could not have played poorer yet still bagged the points. We do have mitigating factors, we rocked up to Bailey Reserve with 15 healthy players, however 10 of these lads play in the forward pack which led to coach James reorganising our team at short notice (during the warm up). The result was an untried centre partnership of Alfie and Doug. Souths had their own player woes, they only had 12 available blokes and had to promote 2 U16's to make up the numbers. Sadly they were lacking a Hooker which led to uncontested scrums.

It was a pretty dull opening, Alfie and Dougie combined in their new roles a couple of times but without real menace. Wellsy saved the day, making a last ditch tackle in our 22. The breakthrough came after 18 minutes, a scrum halfway was picked up by their scrum half and a couple of jinks and he was under the post. Amazingly pressure from Ben and Jasper caused the kicker to push it right. A coaching switch between Dougie and Paddy led to Ben playing centre and gave us more threat. Kees was the first beneficiary, finishing from a scrum 5 metres out to dive over the line.



Souths 2<sup>nd</sup> came from a familiar source, the centres

spreading the ball after "winning" the uncontested scrum. This lead to the unexpected half-time score of 12 -7 in Souths favour. Things turned source for our boys when their scrum half scored their 3<sup>rd</sup> in breaking away himself. The resulting conversion gave them a 12 point lead.

After wasting good ball in their territory our lads finally clicked and realised our best chance of the win is through our pack. Effective pods and battering ram rugby allowed Dougie to get our 2<sup>nd</sup>. Paddy broke away for our 3<sup>rd</sup> try, the resulting conversion from the touchline making the scores level and it seemed like a formality at this point. Paddy's pilfering then looked like resulting in the leading score, starting a quick break down their right. A last gasp, possible deliberate knock on saved the day for Souths (think Wallaby captain David Campese in the 1991 RWC final v England and you get the picture).
