Old Collegians 5 vs Burnside 39

The return fixture against Burnside yielded a similar result to the first round, with the first grade losing 5 tries to 1 in a game where we had potential with ball in hand, but struggled to string together enough phases to put effective pressure on the opposition.

Burnside enjoyed the initial possession and went over early after driving a few phases from a line-out in attacking territory. In response, Old Colls built a sustained period of attack around the Burnside 22, with some promising hit-ups by the forwards seeing Verrall cross the try-line, but he was adjudged to have been held-up. Burnside relieved the attack with a long kick for territorial gain and then won a penalty at a ruck, taking the points on offer.

This became the flavour of the game, as Hopkinson and Fleetwood-Pieper were kept busy cleaning up the long clearance ball at the back, and Burnside kept play in Old Colls half whilst waiting for the inevitable error by Old Colls from dropped passes, directionless play or inadequately engaging and clearing out the rucks. Old Colls also gave away too many penalties from not adapting to the refereeing of high-tackles and the counterruck, and Burnside had a 27 - 0 lead at the break after putting on 2 more tries from line-outs flowing from penalties.

Old Collegians started the second half in more positive fashion, running possession from the kick-off back deep into Burnside territory for several phases, but could not convert this into points. Burnside employed a similar strategy to the first half, keeping the play at our end and smothering our attempts to break out, in the process scoring 2 more tries from set-piece plays after penalties. Old Colls finally got some consistent possession in the last 10 minutes to reach the Burnside 22, alternating the attack side to side from the rucks and opening space on the far wing where Whitehead scored from 20m out.

Ollie Horne, just subbed on, took the conversion to make it 20 - 7. From a complete lack of ability to find a gap in the Burnside defensive line in the first half there was suddenly hope. Better defence on our side and with plenty of ball, Ollie Horne crossed the line 10 minutes later. Ollie again took the conversion attempt. Great contact but this time the ball slid tantalisingly close but just to the outside of the right post. Although playing better now, the chances of winning were remote. Realistically, not enough time to find the necessary 9 points. We knew the second half would be called up short after yet another late start. Right on full-time Burnside worked a Penalty and professionally took the kick to give a final score of 23 - 12.

Changes in the front row this week when we welcomed back Paul Cleary and Benny Blackall. Peter Cross joined the Backs and with the late withdrawal of Noah Saddler, Ben Viljoen proved a valuable substitute. Thanks to Luke Clifton for benching as our reserve Forward and thereby makes us legal. James Bradley then filled in when first grade duties called Luke away. Bradels played a pretty impressive cameo after Benny came off with an injured toe late in the second half.

Another great performance this week from Austin Teagle, with Nic Litchfield and Justin Elder amongst the best. Matt Sharples was his typical dynamic self at half back and we owed our better second half performance to his confident and fast recycling. Games against Burnside are usually competitive, exciting games so on this occasion last Saturday was a disappointing day. Credit has to go to the U10's & U12's as they were the only Old Collegians junior teams to send Burnside back to Parkinson Oval defeated. When the U18's lost at Barossa by a large margin we at least had the comfort of knowing it was our opponents are a skilful, powerful unit who always play us hard and competitive but with a good spirit. To suffer the same fate against our old enemy Burnside is a bitter pill to swallow.

Prior to kick off our coach's Rob and James presented a club tie to our 1^{st} year U18's. Perhaps that so many ties were handed out highlights that many of our blokes are either new to the game or have just moved up from the U16's. We are also struggling at the moment with lack of support on the bench due to injuries, which appears to be taking its toll during these physical games. Poor attendance at training sessions seems to be a factor in below par performance. Hopefully the new training days of Wednesday and Thursday may alleviate this issue.

I'm not going to analyse our performance too much, a half time score of 28 - 0 in Burnside's favour tells the tale. We were outmatched at the breakdown and uncharacteristically sloppy in defence (even making basic errors like allowing the ball to bounce around from up and unders). The only highlight for me was watching our captain and tight head prop make a line break from halfway and race away, only to be thwarted with a last ditch tackle.

Following some frank words from our coaching team there were positives after halftime. We at least drew the second half 7-7, each team converting a try apiece. George Hewitt, in making his debut at the U18' level played a well-controlled game at the Fly-half position, thus allowing Ben to make probing runs from the centres and showed that the future is bright with him and Ben adept at number 10. After his 1st half effort Brad went 1 better when he collected the ball from the base of our ruck and charged over their try-line. In the second half we played a more physical, controlled game and did have some pressure and possession and showed Burnside Old Colls do have fight and ability, but we can't give quality sides such a big early lead.

No opportunity to sing the club song this week, hopefully our blokes can rectify that after the BYE week (which has come at the perfect time for us), our next game is at Brighton RUFC on Saturday June 17th.


