

You will notice in this brief accounting that Mr. McQueen has neglected to increase items 2) - 4) and has based only on an increase in postage. Allowing for a minimal increase of 10% in other charges the figures will become

I feel that these costing figures are still unreasonable and my figure of 90% is too small and will possibly be closer to 20%.

Mr McQueen then goes on to deal with some suggestions on the running of the newsletter and outlines some methods of cutting down the work load involved. Most of these deal directly with and concern the actual editorial job and as such do not really concern the committee as a whole.

However some of these thoughts deal with a new style of newsletter. The most interesting fact is the idea of selling advertising space on a basis of 40 issues. If the advertising space can be sold then the cost of the newsletter would be cut to 70¢ - \$1.50

Then he outlines some advertising sources including some who are already agreeable to the scheme.

Mr McQueen then concludes his report with several suggestions to the committee

- 3) Intro. of a Levy to cover addressograph plates at \$1 - \$2.50

- * 6) Better liason between Registrar & Editor


Council has received a letter from the three residences adjoining the practice wicket section of Tregenza Oval.



Pursuant to an application dated the **Fifteenth** day of **February**, 1974, made to the Licensing Court of South Australia by **Anthony Cunningham Maxwell** the Secretary of the unlicensed club known as **Old Collegians Rugby Club** for a permit to sell and supply liquor for consumption by members of the club, I the undersigned Licensing Court Judge/Magistrate hereby grant a permit to the said club to sell and supply liquor to members of the club for consumption by members of the club and to one visitor of each member to the club such member being present at the time of such sale and consumption, on the portion of the club premises at **Tregenza Oval**

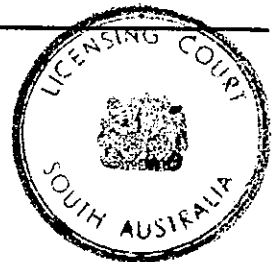
as is specified hereunder subject to such conditions as are set out:—

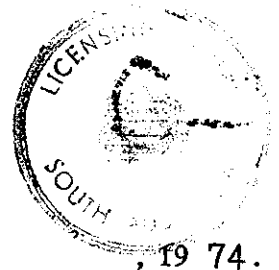

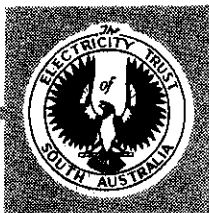
