As has been the case in the last few weeks, the first grade began the game well and had some consistently good passages of play, however eventually took the pressure off as they tired and let the opposition back in. There was some exciting attack and generally strong one on one defence, but too often a turnover was allowed or pass dropped, particularly after we had scored, and Burnside capitalised on their counter-attacking chances.

It was a hectic first 30. In the early stages Kyle Fleetwood-Pieper found some space on the wing around half way and put a chip over the last defender which was regathered by Curtin for the first try. Burnside forced a turnover from the restart and pushed up to our try-line, where their halfback scored with a dummy pass off the back of a ruck. In general play Dawes broke the line and ran the ball to the 22 where the backs passed quickly through the hands and Bartlett scored in the corner. Burnside again pushed back quickly and evened the score with their own second try.

In the last 10 minutes Burnside took advantage of a penalty to kick for touch and, after their line out drive was stopped, went from one side to the other and found an overlap to score out wide. Old Colls tried to run the last play out of our 22 rather than putting the ball into touch, but became isolated and Burnside stripped the ball and scored in reply for a 24 - 10 lead.

Old Colls got things moving again in the second half, pushing hard to earn a couple of penalties and eventually some forward drives off a line out saw the pack force their way over the line where Howlett grounded the ball. Another turnover from the restart however gave Burnside the advantage and they responded in kind with their own forwards' try off a line out, then took the lead to 38-15 with a kick over our defence and regather for their sixth try.

Old Colls rallied after the restart and gained momentum, as Bartlett and McDonough combined to breakthrough the line and run to the 22, finding Sadler inside who beat the last defender. Tim Atkins got great distance off a penalty kick to give the forwards a line out in the 22, and Jake Busby directed the attack phases well, eventually creating enough space for Clifton to crash over. Burnside then cushioned their lead with 3 points off a penalty.

With time running down, Old Colls held a scrum in our 22 and Fleetwood-Pieper broke out to run down the far wing where Burnside knocked his attempted chip into touch. From the ensuing line out Gary Mann scored to equal the tries scored at 6 per side as time ran out.

No one said that the road to the finals was an easy one. This round was an opportunity for us to test ourselves against a quality opposition and see if we were on the right track. We got out of the blocks well and with 5 minutes played Jack Darby was crossing the try line and Jimmy Hopkinson confidently kicking the conversion. But it was obvious early that Burnside would be no pushover and it was only another 5 minutes before they had 7 points on the board. It was to and fro for the remainder of the half. Perhaps more correctly, Burnside doing most of the 'to-ing' and us stoically defending. Word has it that Burnside's scrum has been dominant in recent matches so credit to our pack for holding their own and giving them a real contest.

Will Sadler replaced Matt Sharples close to half time when Matty was forced off with a twisted ankle. A couple of minutes into the second half and Will was over the line and with Jimmy's conversion we were 14 - 7 up! Burnside missed a penalty. Maybe we were on the right track. But no. We had our opportunities but found ourselves getting off the beaten track. With full time looming, a couple of fairly innocuous lapses gifted Burnside two tries in quick succession. That, and a penalty goal to close out the game and Burnside came from behind to win 22 - 14.

Now this could be in the realms of 'we would say that' but Burnside played well and probably near their best and we still have a few cards to play, so... still on the right track.

Amongst our best were Mark Darby, Stu Robertson and Heysen Siegfried. Jack Darby was instrumental in holding our defensive line all day and Peter Cross had a storming game on the flank.

A strong and ready squad took to the field to line up against Burnside on an unusually bright and sunny Saturday afternoon. The kick-off play looks promising with good attack moves. Burnside presented strong but not invincible. The first score went to Burnside with a penalty kick hitting the mark around 7 minutes in. It wasn't long before OC fought back and responded with a try over the line at the 15-minute point with a conversion following. Burnside strikes back with a try and conversion to once more take the lead. The scores were held with Burnside just in front for most of the remainder of the half with the ball finding its way up and down the field both ways as both Burnside and OC made gains but were fought back each other. With just 3 points between us and the lead, the boys fought very hard to gain the lead against an unbeaten Burnside team. Some sloppy play and missed tackles late in the half with only five minutes to go allowed Burnside to bolt past and score the final try of the half. Summer is on its way folks, this was the sunniest and warmest day to watch rugby since the pre-season hit-out at the Adelaide University grounds at Waite Oval in March. It was also both pleasing and encouraging to see all of our fellas support Ladies Day and help with the YMCA Encore Breast cancer Survivorship Programme by sporting the Old Colls pink socks, great work lads. This was by far our most complete performance of 2018, to do it at Tregenza makes it more special, for Burnside to be the recipients even sweeter. You will always win more games than you lose when you put 33 points on the scoreboard. When you keep your opposition scoreless you will win every time.

To be super critical it was not the perfect performance, I am still concerned by the high quantity of conceded penalties (particularly for off-side). However, we attacked with power, pace and precision and when required we defended strongly and well organised and of late the forwards and backs link up superbly. Saying that grunty forward play was the catalyst for our opener. An Old Coll's attacking line-out fell to Kees who, with the benefit of a penalty advantage, went solo and got the 5 pointer. George narrowly missing the conversion although he slotted every one afterwards.

Our 2nd try came courtesy from incisive back play- Ruan made a huge line break which drew in the defenders. The ball was recycled quickly and Michael was the beneficiary with the score. Our 3rd came from the prolific Kees in similar fashion to his 1st. With a halftime lead of 19-0 you could be mistaken in thinking the team talk was all positive. Whilst there was mainly acclaim following such a dominant performance Richie had to highlight that at times we got a tad too fancy with too many basic errors, usually following too ambitious fancy flicks and passes. Due to a miscalculation the start time of the 2nd half was reduced to 25 minutes. At the time Burnside was unhappy as they had a game to chase, by full time this amendment did them a favour and their relief was evident with the score so one sided. Our 4th try was an Old Coll's classic. An attacking Old Coll's scrum was won by us (we'd been dominant in this set-piece) and the ball was whipped down the line for Ruan to beat 2 defenders and score.

Burnside then had a bit of possession and territory and the score looked imminent. However, fantastic goal line defence eventually caused them to knock on, the resulting scrum allowing us to kick for safety. Pretty soon we had turned defence into attack after a precise left foot kick from George gave Michael a long chase. He not only tackled the Burnside player but stripped him of possession. Max made an insightful box kick and chased it himself, only to be thwarted by a desperate lunge by the Burnside fullback. We already had the 4 try bonus point but our 5th try came from another forward – back set-play. Our pack won an attacking lineout, the ball went down the line and George used great vision to give a looping pass, bypassing the heart of the defence and allowing the

overlapping Michael to collect and score with ease, topping off a 33-0 victory.

The game started well with a fired up Connor Ryan showing his muscle to power over to score. RUSA News



We have seen an increased number of incidents of stamping and referee abuse over the last 12 month period.

To deter this type of conduct, the Judicial Committee will from this week be giving higher than usual suspensions for red cards and citations of this type (Rugby Australia Disciplinary Rule 87).

Clubs are reminded that verbal abuse of a referee carries a suspension of 6 matches as a starting point. Stamping carries a suspension of 2 matches as a starting point, or 6 matches if to a player's head. A suspension can be reduced however for stamping/ verbal abuse it will now also be increased as a deterrent.

As we come into Finals for 2018, let's see clean games and good sportsmanship on show.


