

# Coopers Premier Grade Match Report

## Old Collegians 54 vs Souths 24

The first grade finished the season with a convincing win over Souths, ending up fourth and will take on Onkaparinga in the first round of finals. Both sides had chances in the early exchanges, and Souths took advantage of an early line-out win to go wide and push up the wing for a try. Old Colls replied with a more structured attack, rumbling ball in hand to drive up to 5m out where Burgess dived over the line out of a ruck.

Old Colls kept the pressure on and when Souths kicked to clear their line, Bartlett made a strong return with Clifton supporting and being stopped just short, before Champion luckily found his way over the line for his first points this year. When Old Colls got back into the 22, Curtin created some clear space running wide from 5/8 then put Clifton into a hole to this time score the try. After the restart, Old Colls were quickly moving the ball from one wing to the other and coming up, advancing to the red zone where Curtin cut back inside and past the last defender for his first. Souths showed they remained dangerous, quick tapping a free kick from a scrum and their backs flooded the blind side to score their second. In the final minutes Old Colls gained good position on the back of subsequent penalties, ultimately taking a scrum 10m out where Curtin hit up 1 off and snuck under the posts for a 33 - 10 half time lead.

Souths came out and pushed hard with ball in hand for the first 10 but were contained by stout defence. Eventually they conceded a penalty which was kicked for territory and the forwards drove the line-out, then Fleetwood-Pieper crashed through in the middle of the field for the first points of the second half. The game settled into a bit of a stalemate for a while, going back and forth until Souths tried to run it out of their defensive area and Atkins picked off an intercept to run away for a try. Not to be outdone, Souths grabbed back 2 tries with 2 intercepts in 5 minutes as Old Colls were on the attack. In the last passages of play Champion stole a line-out and Souths were penalised, giving the opportunity to set a final line-out drive close to the line, which the forwards drove up and Mekomoko steered over and dotted down.
