The First Grade's opening game of the year was a mixed outing, with Onkaparinga scoring 8 tries to Old Collegians' 5, but there were pockets of well-constructed phase play that showed much of the pre-season training structure coming through.

Old Collegians controlled the first 10 minutes, pressuring from the kick-off to secure good field position in the Onkaparinga 22, where a solid scrum win was spread wide to Fleetwood-Pieper who scored in the corner. Onkas hit back quickly with 2 converted tries and a penalty, before Fleetwood-Pieper and Paseka broke out of our half to get play back into the Onkas 22, with Paseka ultimately forcing his way over the line from a penalty. Onkaparinga kept much of the rest of the play in Old Collegians territory with a long kicking game, taking all their available chances to add 2 more tries, a penalty and a field goal for a 37-12 half time lead.

The second half was more even as the sides traded tries scored, the main difference being that most of those by Old Collegians were constructed over several phases, whereas Onkaparinga took advantage of some poor first-up tackling to break through our defensive line from further out.

U6/7's — Match Report


Onkaparinga vs Old Collegians
